

#### **FY 2023 Fundraising Goals**

Following is a list of the fundraising goals for this year:

- \$2,000 FY 2023 Friends administrative budget.
- \$3,000 159th Battle Anniversary meals, incidentals
- \$10,000 Funds to be used in conjunction with the Park to acquire an additional cannon and trailer (total cost estimated to be \$82,000) for the Living History program.

#### **Current Status Of Park**

All NPS outdoor events at Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park are being conducted.

All trails are open. All parking lots are open. The Mountain Road parking lot is open when the Mountain Road is open.

Visitor Center is now open; masks are *required*.

The Visitor Center theater is open - the movie is being shown.

The Mountain Rd. is open to motorized vehicles on weekdays (excluding major holidays), however the Park bus is not making trips on the weekend to the Mountain Top until further notice."

The horse trail crossing on John Ward Creek on the Kolb Farm East Trail is closed until further notice because of the treacherous creek crossing there.

## **Expect delays at Dallas Hwy and Whitlock Ave**

Crews will start clearing work for the Whitlock Avenue trail segment of the Kennesaw Mountain Pedestrian Improvements on Monday, Oct. 25. Significant delays are expected along Dallas Highway/Whitlock Avenue between John Ward Road and Cheatham Hill Drive. Crews will be working in the area from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. on weekdays, and road capacity will be reduced to one lane.

Traffic delays are expected to be worse in the afternoon in the westbound direction. Alternate routes are recommended.

#### The Society of the Atlanta Campaign

Mountain, there were many efforts to save the preeminent battle of the Atlanta Campaign. One of the more unique plans came from the Society of the Atlanta Campaign, a mysterious organization that seemed to have started in late 1897. A letter by the group's acting secretary, George E. Dolton, was published in newspapers across the country in early 1898. The letter seems to have been written on December 31, 1897, "to the veterans of the Atlanta Campaign."

In the letter, Dolton explained that a new organization had been formed for soldiers who served under "Sherman, Johnston, and Hood" and that it would have two goals: "social purposes" and creating a park at Kennesaw Mountain. The letter also included a copy of the society's logo. Accounts of the new organization emphasized it was intended for veterans of both sides, but more Northern newspapers chose to reprint the article.

this effort, George E. Dolton. He was born July 27, 1840, and was a schoolteacher before the Civil War. He was in Battery M of the 1st Illinois Light Artillery during the war, achieving the rank of Corporal. Afterwards, Dolton moved to St. Louis and became a merchant. He was involved in the Grand Army of the Republic, but Dolton was upset that some GAR members were inflating their wartime accomplishments. He created his own (somewhat satirical) group called the "Comrades of the Battlefield." When he passed away in 1906, he was buried in Missouri.

involved in the society was A. B. Leeper, the "Major General commanding the department of Illinois" in the Comrades of the Battlefield. Leeper was spearheading the Kennesaw Mountain preservation effort by April 1898. Newspaper accounts mention that "the originator of this scheme has not been discovered by the public down this way [i.e., Georgia]." Leeper was in Company B of the 115<sup>th</sup> Illinois Infantry during the Civil War and claimed he fired the war's last shot. He referred to himself as "the man who put down the Rebellion."

ccording to research by Dr.. Joe Squillace, Leeper was known for always wearing his uniform from the Grand Army of the Republic. He was also in a mental asylum on at least ten different occasions and started a newspaper called the Lunatic Herald. Finally,

Dr.. Squillace found that Leeper once wrote a letter to world monarchs asking that they hold a tribunal to decide the fate of the American republic and that they become "conservator of the United States."


eeper's plan Mountain is audacious, with newspapers saying it would rival "the Colossus of Rhodes, Washington Monument, Statue of Liberty, and the great pyramid of Cheops or Corfu [sic]." Around the mountain, "the greatest military national park in the world" would be

created. At the summit an eighty-foot-tall statue would be erected of an American soldier. Its exterior would be white glass, with bright electric lights to illuminate it at night. It would be so bright "that the inhabitants of other planets will think that earth [sic] has a new moon located about twenty miles west of Atlanta." As part of this plan, a meeting of Atlanta Campaign veterans was planned for around June 27, 1898.

ven these grand plans were not enough. The giant glass statue would need a steel framework, and Leeper wrote a letter to Secretary of the Navy John Davis Long asking that the then-recently-sunk USS Maine be raised from Havana Harbor. (The sinking of the Maine had started the Spanish-American War several months before.) Once the Maine was raised, Leeper wanted its steel to be used for the statue's framework. According to Leeper,

In this monument every American veteran would have an interest, and as the achievements of the United States Navy are as worthy of commemoration as are those of the United States Army, and as the proposed monument or tower will probably be constructed practically of steel, I have thought within the last hour that instead of towing the wreck out into the ocean and sinking it, why not tow it to Key West or Tampa,

from either of which points the material could be shipped to Atlanta for the use in the erection of the colossal monument to the valor of the American Army and Navy.

became a reality. The only development after mid-1898 that has been found was a puzzle written by G. E. Dolton for the May 5, 1902 *St. Louis Post-Dispatch*:

Big Kennesaw Mountain, Ga., is 1828 [sic] feet high. On its summit, it is proposed to erect a monument to American valor. The monument, including a statue of the Goddess of Liberty on its top, is to be 560 feet high. How far can one see the horizon, looking from the top of the head of the Goddess, supposing the earth there to be a true curve of the earth? [sic]

he answer, published in the paper three days later, was 60 miles. By this time plans for the "greatest military national park in the world" seem to have floundered, and it is unclear if Dolton was serious in his 1902 proposal. It is interesting to think what the park would look like if these plans had not failed. On a side note, the USS *Maine* was later raised from Havana Harbor, and one of her gun turrets can today be found in Chattanooga.



On June 27, 1864, Colonel Daniel McCook, Jr. led the Federal assault up Cheatham Hill, where he was mortally wounded. This brave man was not the only McCook to fight for the Federal army. 

#### John Ward Creek Crossing Closed to Horseback Riders

Kennesaw, GA – Effective immediately, the John Ward Creek crossing just south of the Illinois Monument is closed to horseback riders until further notice. This closure stems from a safety concern due to hazardous conditions relating to an unstable streambed. The closure affects the creek crossing between Milepost 3.5 and Milepost 4 of the Kolb's Farm East Trail.

Superintendent Patrick Gamman states, "We are concerned for the safety of all park users. Crossing John Ward Creek at this section of the trail poses a risk that we want to alert our horse community to, as it could potentially cause harm to both horse and rider. We will be working as quickly as possible to mitigate this problem."


