Current Status Of Park

All NPS outdoor events at Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park are being conducted.

All trails are open, except as noted, below. All parking lots are open. The Mountain Road parking lot is open when the Mountain Road is open.

Visitor Center is now open; masks are optional.

The Visitor Center theater is open - the movie is being shown.

The Mountain Rd. is open to motorized vehicles on weekdays only (excluding major holidays), however the Park bus is not making trips on the weekend to the Mountain Top until further notice."

Trail closures

The horse trail crossing on John Ward Creek on the Kolb Farm East Trail is closed until further notice because of the treacherous creek crossing there.

The New Salem Church trail is currently closed where it crosses Burnt Hickory Rd., the multiuse trail has been completed and there is a temporary Salem Church Trail reroute. Current plans are to have the reroute completed in the fall, 2023.

Ribbon-Cutting Ceremony

On June 9th, at the Pigeon Hill Parking Lot, a Ribbon-Cutting Ceremony was held to commemorate the completion of a multi-use set of paved trails eight- to ten-foot-wide running along Cheatham Hill Road between Powder Springs and John Ward roads for 2 miles, along Whitlock Avenue for half a mile east of John Ward Road, and along Burnt Hickory Road between Whitlock Avenue and Old Mountain Road for 1.25 miles. This included a re-route of the New Salem Trail Burnt Hickory crossing, along with a pedestrian crossing light, and a pedestrian crossing light on Cheatham Hill Rd. at the Cheatham Hill Parking Lot.

The Cobb Department of Transportation oversaw the project, one of the county's 2019 special-purpose local option sales tax items, in partnership with the National Park Service and city of Marietta.

"The project we are celebrating today took almost seven years to the day to complete," said Cobb DOT Director Drew Raessler. "It is a model of partnership between numerous local, state and federal agencies."

John Ward Creek Crossing Closed to Horseback Riders

Kennesaw, GA – Effective immediately, the John Ward Creek crossing just south of the Illinois Monument is closed to horseback riders until further notice. This closure stems from a safety concern due to hazardous conditions relating to an unstable streambed. The closure affects the creek crossing between Milepost 3.5 and Milepost 4 of the Kolb's Farm East Trail.

Superintendent Patrick Gamman states, "We are concerned for the safety of all park users. Crossing John Ward Creek at this section of the trail poses a risk that we want to alert our horse community to, as it could potentially cause harm to both horse and rider. We will be working as quickly as possible to mitigate this problem."

July 1, @11 am – Cheatham Hill History Walk

On the morning of June 27th, 1864, the hills of Georgia exploded with the sounds of a terrific battle. Join us on this easy, Ranger- led stroll around one of the most significant areas of the Atlanta Campaign.

*This program is not at the Visitor Center; parking is at the Illinois Monument parking lot

July 2, @11 am – Life of a Soldier

Life for the infantry soldier (Union or Confederate) was anything but easy. Long marches, bad food, and worse living conditions made it tough going for these young men. Join us as we lay out the gear that made such intense campaigning possible. You will see period- correct uniforms, weaponry and even get up close and personal with artifacts from the Battle of Kennesaw Mountain!

July 8, @ 11 am- Assault Trail Hike

On June 27th, 1864, nearly 9,000 Union soldiers made a historic charge into what they believed would be death or capture.

Follow in the footsteps of these brave men as this ranger - guided tour explores the heaviest area of fighting during the battle.

*This program is not at the Visitor Center; parking is at the Activity Area 3 on Cheatham Hill Rd..

July 9, @ 11 am – Pigeon Hill History Hike

"And from the earth there sprang a host of men..." On June 27th, 1864, some of the heaviest and most desperate fighting of the American Civil War would take place on a spur in rural Georgia. This Ranger- led history hike will be moderately difficult, so bring good shoes and plenty of water.

*This program is not at the Visitor Center; parking is at Pigeon Hill at the intersection of Old Mountain Rd. and Burnt Hickory Rd.

July 15, @ 11 am, 12, 2 and 3 – Artillery Demonstrations

Artillery was a vital component to the operations of both armies during the Atlanta Campaign and played a key role in several engagements during the Battle of Kennesaw Mountain. Our living historians will hold camp and shoot the cannon at the above- listed times. Will be held at the front field.

July 16, @ 11 am – Mountaintop Hike

This ranger - led hike will take you roughly 1 mile up to the peak of Big Kennesaw Mountain. Along the way, you'll learn about the flora and fauna of the area and the history that shapes us from pre - history, through Civil War and on to today. The hike is semi - strenuous so bring water and good shoes!

July 22 and 23 @ 11 am, 12, 2 and 3 – Infantry Demonstrations

Life for the infantry soldier (Union or Confederate) was anything but easy. Long marches, bad food, and worse living conditions made it tough going for these young men. Living historians from the 4th KY and 33rd AL will be on site to give you an up close and personal look at the life of a soldiers for this toughest of campaigns.

July 29 @11 am, 12, 2 and 3 – Artillery Demonstrations

Artillery was a vital component to the operations of both armies during the Atlanta Campaign and played a key role in several engagements during the Battle of Kennesaw Mountain. Our living historians will hold camp and shoot the cannon at the above- listed times. Will be held at the front field.

July 30 @ 11 am- Chemical Warfare and Technology in the Civil War

"The weapons technology of the Civil War grew exponentially. The Gatling gun and the Henry rifle were some of the more popular examples. But did you know that there were proposals for poison gas shells, and the Ketchum grenade? Meet near the Visitor Center front desk to join the discussion about the forgotten technology and innovation seen during the war.



Workday 06-10-23

On Thursday, June 8, Eric, Fred, Rich, Tom, and Mike reviewed the work plan while walking the Noses Creek Trail. We talked to David and Zoe about what they had done so far and what they expected to have done by Saturday morning.

We had 12 crew leaders and 1 trainee for the workday. The Crew Leaders were Anna, Bill, Donald, Eric, Fred, Geoff, Mark, Rich, Robert, Todd, Tom, and Mike. Rick was under instruction. We had 6 Ambassadors, they were Carine, Dave, Joanne, Debbie, Rena, and Wendy. They did registration and directed the volunteers to the parking area. Dave and Joanne also helped with trail maintenance. We had 10 volunteers. Fred took pictures. Geoff monitored the parking area while we worked. The volunteers were from Boy Scout Troop 1916, the Atlanta Outdoor Club, and individuals.

On Saturday, I updated the Crew Leaders as to what David and Zoe had accomplished Thursday afternoon and Friday. I welcomed the volunteers, the volunteers picked up tools and headed for the worksite. At the worksite a safety brief was conducted. We worked as one large group with Donald and myself providing instructions and guidance.

We started from the south side of the Noses Creek Bridge and worked our way back toward the Pigeon Hill Parking Lot. We created 5 berms to restrict water flow from the material David had staged and cleaned the drainage ditches on the side of the trail. Donald also led a small group to fix an erosion problem on the trail going to the Hardage Mill Trail by the bridge.

Next, we moved to the north side of the Noses Creek Bridge; we created 6 berms to restrict water flow from the material David had staged and cleaned the drainage ditches on the side of the trail.

We finished on the uphill side of the trail just past the creek before you get to the right turn going to the Hardage Mill Trail. Because the trail going through a valley between two uphill slopes we used the staged material to fill several low spots and contoured the slope to improve water flow and cleaned the ditches.
