

John Ward Creek Crossing Closed to Horseback Riders

Kennesaw, GA – Effective immediately, the John Ward Creek crossing just south of the Illinois Monument is closed to horseback riders until further notice. This closure stems from a safety concern due to hazardous conditions relating to an unstable streambed. The closure affects the creek crossing between Milepost 3.5 and Milepost 4 of the Kolb's Farm East Trail.

Superintendent Patrick Gamman states, "We are concerned for the safety of all park users. Crossing John Ward Creek at this section of the trail poses a risk that we want to alert our horse community to, as it could potentially cause harm to both horse and rider. We will be working as quickly as possible to mitigate this problem."





Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park **Interpretive Programs for January**

*All outdoor programs are weather-dependent. *Unless otherwise noted, all programs will be held at the Visitor Center

Museum Tours every Monday, Wednesday, and Friday @ 2:00 pm!

January 4, @ 11 am – Atlanta Campaign Map Talk

"All that has come before has been mere skirmishing." The Atlanta Campaign is considered one of the most pivotal and influential set of battles during the Civil War. Join one of our rangers for a short discussion on these battles and the maps that tie them together.

January 5, @ 11 am - Pigeon Hill Hike "And from the earth there sprang a host of men..." On June 27th, 1864, some of the heaviest and most desperate fighting of the American Civil War would take place on a spur in rural Georgia. This Ranger-led history hike will be moderately difficult, so bring good shoes and plenty of water.

*This program is not at the Visitor Center; parking is at Pigeon Hill at the intersection of Old Mountain Rd and Burnt Hickory Rd

January 11 @ 11 am - Western & Atlantic Railroad Lecture

During the Civil War, the railroad networks were vital to the survival of armies and civilians alike. During the Atlanta Campaign, the Western & Atlantic Railroad, which connected Atlanta and Chattanooga, took center stage. Join this short ranger lecture on the significance of this railway to the battles for Atlanta.

January 12 @ 11 am – 24 – Gun Battery Hike

"The enemy's fire ceased after about 10 minutes, but created a path of destruction while it lasted"--Confederate Captain James Hoskins on the U.S 24-Gun Battery. Join this approximately 1.5 mile, ranger-led hike to the site of this 24-gun position. The hike will include opportunities to see pre-and-post war history in the park, as well as a chance to see some of its wonderful natural resources.

January 18 @ 2:00 pm - 13th Amendment Lecture

While Abraham Lincoln would not live to see the affect of his Emancipation Proclamation, it's legacy would be cemented by the 13th Amendment. Officially outlawing the institution of slavery in the United States, this amendment would be one of the first large scale steps towards civil rights in the wake of the Civil War. Join us for a ranger-led lecture on the topic.

January 19 @ 11 am - Sherman's Special Field Orders 15 Lecture

Almost a month after William T. Sherman's forces enter Savannah, the general would issue Special Field Orders No. 15. During the early years of the war, many southern planters evacuated the Georgia, Florida, and South Carolina coast in response to U.S Navy presence. Sherman's orders would redistribute captured southern land on the coastline to the enslaved people that were still present. This short ranger talk dives into the background of these orders as well as the reaction and realities post war.

January 25 @11 am - Ranger Led Museum Tour


One of the best ways to begin your visit to Kennesaw Mountain (or enhance what you already know) is to spend time in the park's museum. And what better way to do that than to have a ranger as your guide? Join us for this ranger-led walk and talk through the park's exhibits and artifacts.

January 26 @11 am – Mountain Top Hike

This ranger-led hike will take you roughly 1 mile up to the peak of Big Kennesaw Mountain. Along the way, you'll learn about the flora and fauna of the area and the history that shapes us from pre-history, through Civil War and on to today. The hike is semi-strenuous so bring water and good shoes!


These positions are needed to advance the Friend's mission as the Philanthropic Partner of Kennesaw Mountain NBP, NPS.



Workday 12-14-24

On Friday, December 13, Bill, Eric, Mike C, Tom, and I reviewed the work plan.

This work plan covered annual maintenance on the Kennesaw Mountain Trail from the Visitor Center to the parking lot on Kennesaw Mountain Road.

We had 14 crew leaders for the workday. The Crew Leaders were Andy, Bill, Curt, Donald, Eric, Fred, Geoff, Kirsten, Rich, Robert, Tom, and me. We had 2 Crew Leaders under instruction: they were Donna and Mike C; and 4 Trail Ambassadors: they were Debbie, Doug, Laurie, and Yvonne, and 1 under instruction, Brendon. The Trail Ambassadors did registration and directed the volunteers to the parking area. We had 6 volunteers. The volunteers were from Allatoona JROTC Unit (4), the Atlanta Outdoor Club (4, 3 of which Donna, Kirsten, and I are also Crew Leaders, thus 1), and one individual.

On Saturday I welcomed the volunteers and conducted the safety briefing at the tool shed. We split into four groups.

the workplan at the bottom of the Kennesaw Mountain Trail removing debris from where the trail met Kennesaw Mountain Road and the conduit as you go up the mountain; they stacked the rocks on the left hand of the

trail from where they had fallen into the conduit. Upon completion of this, they joined Group 2.

Group 2, led by Tom with Andy, Robert, Kirsten, and Donna assisting and 2 from Allatoona High School, the Individual, and the AOC member started working on line 7 of the work plan. Starting at the turn on the service road going down and across Kennesaw Mountain Road they cleaned the ditches and drains.

Group 3, led by Eric with Rich and Curt, started working on line 3 of the work plan where they closed both social trails cutting from the lower to upper part of the service road. Upon completion Eric joined Donald in Group 4 and Rich and Curt joined Tom in Group 2.

Group 4 led by Donald started working in line 4 where he restacked fencing and started working on line 5 with Eric joining him. They restacked the fencing until they got to the point of needing new fencing.

Fred took pictures and I bounced between the three teams ensuring they were following the work plan and park regulations.

Overall, not a bad workday. Although it was a bit cold to start, once the sun came out it warmed up nicely.

We are back in the business of trail maintenance! See the sign-up links, above. We are still limiting our numbers, but anyone one is now welcome to sign-up.

The Trail Club will provide supervision and tools. Volunteers should wear work clothes (*long pants are required*) and closed toed shoes. Participants are encouraged to bring their own water, work gloves and masks. The NPS Volunteer Service Agreement and COVID forms are required, signed by a parent or guardian, if the student is under 18 years old. For January's work day, parking and registration will be in the field near the Visitor's Center. Vehicle Entrance Passes will issued at registration.

Since our beginning in 2002, the Trail Club has donated over 281,000 volunteer hours to Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park.
