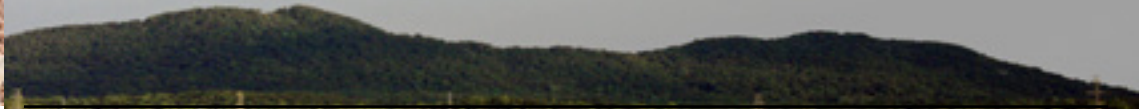

The Visitor Center theater is open - the movie is being shown.

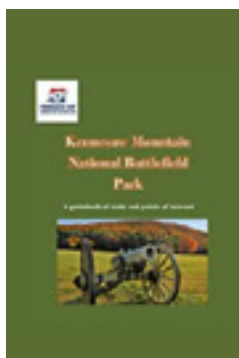
The Mountain Rd. is open to motorized vehicles on weekdays only (excluding major holidays)

John Ward Creek Crossing Closed to Horseback Riders

Kennesaw, GA – Effective immediately, the John Ward Creek crossing just south of the Illinois Monument is closed to horseback riders until further notice. This closure stems from a safety concern due to hazardous conditions relating to an unstable streambed. The closure affects the creek crossing between Milepost 3.5 and Milepost 4 of the Kolb’s Farm East Trail.

Superintendent Patrick Gamman states, “We are concerned for the safety of all park users. Crossing John Ward Creek at this section of the trail poses a risk that we want to alert our horse community to, as it could potentially cause harm to both horse and rider. We will be working as quickly as possible to mitigate this problem.”

Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park Interpretive Programs for **March**

*All outdoor programs are weather- dependent.

*Unless otherwise noted, all programs will be held at the Visitor Center

Museum Tours every Monday, Wednesday, and Friday @ 2:00 pm!

March 1st, @11 am–Mountaintop Hike

This ranger-led hike will take you roughly 1 mile up to the peak of Big Kennesaw Mountain. Along the way, you'll learn about the flora and fauna of the area and the history that shapes us from pre-history, through Civil War and on to today.

The hike is semi-strenuous so bring water and good shoes!

March 2nd, @11 am – Life of a Soldier Gear Layout

Life for the infantry soldier (Union or Confederate) was anything but easy. Long marches, bad food, and worse living conditions made it tough going for these young men. Join us as we lay out the gear that made such intense campaigning possible. You will see period-correct uniforms, weaponry and even get up close and personal with artifacts from the Battle of Kennesaw Mountain!

March 8th, @ 11 am – Cheatham Hill Battlefield Walk

Come on out and enjoy a casual, history-focused walk around one of the most significant sites of the Battle of Kennesaw Mountain. Hear accounts from Union and Confederate survivors, and fully experience the area that would earn the nickname of the "***Dead Angle.***"

March 9th, @11 am – 24 Gun Battery Hike

"The enemy's fire ceased after about 10 minutes, but created a path of destruction while it lasted"-
-Confederate Captain James Hoskins on the U.S. 24-Gun Battery. Join this approximately 1.5 mile, ranger-led hike to the site of this 24-gun position. The hike will include opportunities to see pre – and - post war history in the park, as well as a chance to see some of its wonderful natural resources.

March 15th, @11 am – Cheatham Hill Veteran Talk

After the Civil War had concluded, a veteran group from Illinois came together to purchase and preserve a portion of the Kennesaw Mountain battlefield where they saw some of the fiercest fighting experienced during the conflict, and in memory of their fallen commander. Learn about the fascinating post- war history of Cheatham Hill and the decisions made that would lead to the formation of Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park as we know it today.

March 16th, @ 11 am – Picket Line Walk

The Battle of Kennesaw Mountain was a large-scale offensive with many moving parts. One of the first actions of that day was a diversionary attack at the base of Kennesaw Mountain itself and part of the way up the slope. Join one of our rangers for a short walk along this line of battle as they detail the techniques, tactics, and aftermath of this fateful assault.

This walk includes rolling, rocky terrain and is approximately 1.3 mile long.

March 22nd, @11 am– Atlanta Campaign Map Talk

“All that has come before has been mere skirmishing.” The Atlanta Campaign is considered one of the most pivotal and influential set of battles during the Civil War. Join one of our rangers for a short discussion on these battles and the maps that tie them together.

March 29th, @11 am– Assault Trail Hike

On June 27th, 1864, nearly 9,000 Union soldiers made a historic charge into what they believed would be death or capture. Follow in the footsteps of these brave men as this ranger - guided tour explores the heaviest area of fighting during the battle.

Pigeon Hill Forest Fire

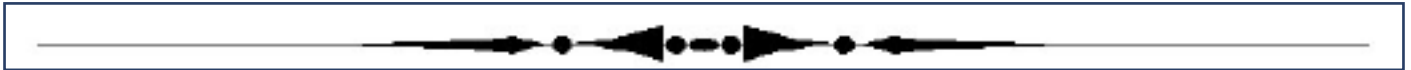

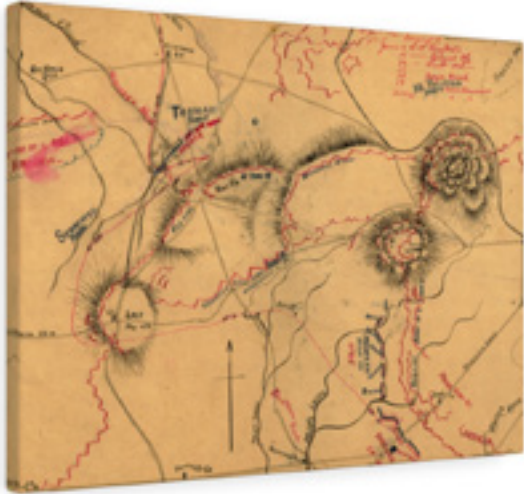

Workday 02-08-25

On Friday, February 7, Aron P, Eric, Mark, Rich, Tom, and I reviewed the workplan.

This workplan covered cyclic maintenance on the Camp Brumby Trail past Camp Brumby to the New Salem Church Trail.

We had 13 crew leaders for the workday. The Crew Leaders were Aaron O, Aron P, Curt, Donald, Eric, Fred, Geoff, Mark, Mike C, Rich, Robert, Tom, and me. We had 2 Ambassadors, Karen, and Laurie, and 1 under instruction Barb. They did registration. We had 26 volunteers. The volunteers were from Allatoona JROTC Unit (16), Hillgrove JROTC Unit (2) the Atlanta Outdoor Club (7, 2 of which Mark, and I are also Crew Leaders, thus 5 of these 3 were first timers), and 3 individuals that signed up on the Friends website.

On Saturday I welcomed the volunteers and conducted the safety briefing at the picnic area. We split into three groups.

Group 1, led by Aron O with Eric and Rich assisting, and 8 from Allatoona High School started working past Camp Brumby, when finished they leaftrogged to the next worksite.

Group 2, led by Aaron P with Curt and Mark assisting, and 2 from Hillgrove High School, 3 individuals, and the 5 from the AOC started working at a site about 200 yards past Group 1; when they finished, they leapfrogged to the next worksite.

Group 3, led by Tom with Mike C and Robert assisting, and 8 from Allatoona High School, started working at a site about 100 yards past Group 2; when finished they leapfrogged to the next worksite.

All three groups did a combination of debarbing, cleaning ditches and conduits of leaves, and naturalizing creep and socials trails.

We could not have asked for better weather; the temperature was ideal for walking to the work sites and performing trail maintenance. Overall, we accomplished over 80% of the workplan by going down the Camp Brumby Trail starting at Camp Brumby for a total distance from the Visitor Center about 2.5 miles.

Fred took pictures, Donald directed volunteers to parking until we started then he and Geoff took the tools to and from the worksite and made sure everyone had water, and I bounced between the three teams ensuring they were following the workplan and park regulations.

Upcoming Work Day Schedule:

We are back in the business of trail maintenance! See the sign-up links, above. We are still limiting our numbers, but anyone one is now welcome to sign-up.

The Trail Club will provide supervision and tools. Volunteers should wear work clothes (**long pants are required**) and closed toed shoes. Participants are encouraged to bring their own water, work gloves and masks. The NPS Volunteer Service Agreement and COVID forms are required, signed by a parent or guardian, if the student is under 18 years old. The forms are available on the trail club web site: <http://www.kennesawmountaintrailclub.org/volunteer.php>

For March's work day, parking and registration will be in the Cheatham Hill Dr. parking lot near the Illinois Monument. Vehicle Entrance Passes will issued at registration. Registration will be open at 8 am.

If your school, church, business, or community organization would like to schedule a special work day as a team

building or public service activity, e-mail us at trails@kennesawmountaintrailclub.org at least 4 weeks in advance. Trail work can be performed any day of the week.

We work closely with the Park Service and assist the park staff by providing critically needed volunteer effort to install signs, build bridges, and maintain the 20+ miles of trails. Since our beginning in 2002, the Trail Club has donated over 281,000 volunteer hours to Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park.

We hope to see you at a work day as soon as we return to our normal work days.

Cancellation policy

If rain is forecast for the work day, we will issue a cancellation notice on our website at least 24 hours before hand. In addition, during the winter months, if the temperature is forecast to be below 40 degrees, we will also issue a cancellation at least 24 hours prior to the work day.
