Visitor Center is now open; masks are **optional**. The Visitor Center theater is open - the movie is being shown.


The Mountain Rd. is open to motorized vehicles on weekdays only (excluding major holidays)

#### John Ward Creek Crossing Closed to Horseback Riders

Kennesaw, GA – Effective immediately, the John Ward Creek crossing just south of the Illinois Monument is closed to horseback riders until further notice. This closure stems from a safety concern due to hazardous conditions relating to an unstable streambed. The closure affects the creek crossing between Milepost 3.5 and Milepost 4 of the Kolb's Farm East Trail.

Superintendent Patrick Gamman states, "We are concerned for the safety of all park users. Crossing John Ward Creek at this section of the trail poses a risk that we want to alert our horse community to, as it could potentially cause harm to both horse and rider. We will be working as quickly as possible to mitigate this problem."

# **Beautiful Changes at Kennesaw Mountain**

As we enter the last month of spring, it is a beautiful reminder that Kennesaw Mountain NBP experiences change and growth with each season. There have been many changes during this fiscal year; however, with change comes growth. Beginning in May, the park will see large construction projects take place along Stilesboro Road. This will be in preparation for the larger upcoming construction project taking place along Old US Highway 41. This project is to continue throughout 2025. Another construction project that has been scheduled for the park is the construction of the John Ward Creek Crossing. This crossing has been closed since 2021 and has had several setbacks; however, the park has finally been given approval to move forward. More information is to come in the upcoming months. Additionally, the park has been able to post a several volunteer positions on www.volunteer.gov. Through use of the site, the park will be able to present a wide array of volunteer opportunities and update potential volunteers on how they can give back.

Another change that we can always expect is the unpredictable Georgia spring weather. Please remember to remain safe while volunteering at the park. Here are a few safety tips while enjoying the remainder of spring in Georgia.

- Check the weather before leaving the house.
- Wear non-slip shoes to prevent slipping on wet surfaces.
- Keep an umbrella in your car.
- Apply sunscreen before working/volunteering in the sun.
- Stay hydrated while volunteering having a reuseable water bottle handy.
- Always have an extra layer of clothing (sweatshirt, jacket, etc.) in case the temperature drops while volunteering.

These are just a few of the changes that have and will be taking place at Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park as well as safety tips to remember. Even with these changes, the park has a couple of longstanding events that we hope volunteers will be able to participate in: the 161st Battle of Kennesaw Mountain Anniversary (June 28 - 29, 2025) and the Marietta Let Freedom Ring Parade (July 4, 2025) – more information to come regarding the events.

# Stilesboro Road Closures - Beginning May 6, 2025

Kennesaw Mountain NBP, Cobb County DOT, and Cobb County Marietta Water Authority (CCMWA) have been working together regarding a large upcoming project regarding Stilesboro Road. Please plan accordingly when coming to the park to volunteer. The park will be providing additional information through the various media outlets; however, if you have any questions, please feel free to contact the park. If any changes to the schedule takes place, you will be notified.

Below is the information provided by the project manager:

Beginning on Tuesday, May 6, the Cobb County Department of Transportation, and Cobb County Marietta Water Authority (CCMWA) contactors will be closing Stilesboro Road to replace and upgrade an underground water piping system that runs underneath the centerline of the road. This closure will occur in three phases and will also tie into the pre-construction work affiliated with the proposed new roundabouts on Old 41 Highway.

- Phase 1 of this closure of Stilesboro Road will span from Gilbert Road to Old Mountain Road. This closure will begin on Tuesday, May 6.
- Phase 2 of this road closure will span from Old Mountain Road to NPS Visitor Center Drive and work is expected to begin early August.
- Phase 3 of this road closure will span from Old 41 Highway to NPS Visitor Center Drive and work is expected to begin late September.

There will be multiple detours to utilize while traveling during this necessary closure. Please reference the approved detour map.



This was a pine tree that just exploded after being hit with a major lightning bolt.



# <u>May 3, @11 am, 12 pm, 2 pm and 3 pm – Infantry Demonstrations</u>

The Civil War was the first modern war in history, fought using tactics and techniques still relevant to the battlefield today. Come out and experience our living historians as they encamp and offer rifle firing demonstrations at the above-listed times.

# <u> May 4, @ 11 am, 12 pm, 2 pm and 3 pm – Artillery Demonstrations</u>

Artillery was a vital component to the operations of both armies during the Atlanta Campaign and played a key role in several engagements during the Battle of Kennesaw Mountain. Our living historians will hold camp and shoot the cannon at the above- listed times.

# <u>May 10 @11 am – The Fighting McCooks</u>

On June 27, 1864, Colonel Daniel McCook, Jr. led the Federal assault up Cheatham Hill, where he was mortally wounded. This brave man was not the only McCook to fight for the Federal army. This 30-minute program will introduce the 'Fighting McCooks', the story of 3 Ohio brothers and their 15 sons who joined the Federal forces and fought throughout the Civil War.

## <u>May 11 @ 11 am – Pigeon Hill Hike</u>

On June 27<sup>th</sup>, 1864, Federal forces advanced against the Confederate trenches north of Burnt Hickory Road. Experience the fight for Kennesaw Mountain as it happened and hear accounts from the soldiers who fought there. There will be some hiking involved up the hill so make sure to have good footwear and plenty of water.

## May 17 @10 am – Park Safety and Rescue Expo

Join us for a great time of learning about Search and Rescue as it applies to Cobb County and beyond. You will learn about the Emergency Locator Marker System in place on the trails in Cobb County and how to use them. Activities subjects will include orientation/map and compass skills as well as a Canine Search and Rescue demonstration! This program will take place just outside of the Visitor Center.

#### <u>May 18, @11 am – Assault Trail Hike</u>

On June 27th, 1864, nearly 9,000 Union soldiers made a historic charge into what they believed would be death or capture. Follow in the footsteps of these brave men as this ranger - guided tour explores the heaviest area of fighting during the battle.



Dear Georgia Leaders:

We, the undersigned, are writing to express our enthusiastic support for HB 454, Vince Dooley Battlefield Trust Fund Act, introduced by Rep. Houston Gaines (R-Athens). HB 454 passed the Georgia House of Representatives on March 3, 2025, and is pending in the Senate Committee on Economic Development and Tourism.

According to landmark studies by the National Park Service (NPS), Georgia is home to 34 battlefields considered among the most historically significant in the nation. NPS has identified these hallowed grounds as priorities for preservation, with several of them partially protected as federal or state parks. These include such storied battlefields as Brier Creek, Chickamauga, Fort Morris, Fort Pulaski, Kennesaw Mountain, Kettle Creek, Resaca and Savannah. Thousands of acres associated with these struggles remain unprotected and vulnerable to development.

The key to the new program is its 1-to-1 matching grants formula, which encourages federal and private sector investment in battlefield preservation in Georgia. Recognizing the value of attracting out-of-state funding for acquisition of historic open space, Kentucky, Tennessee, Mississippi and Virginia have established similar battlefield preservation programs.

Further, these battlefields are economic engines, attracting out-of-state visitors who spend millions on food, accommodations and the other attractions that Georgia has to offer. For example, in 2023, the three Georgia battlefields administered by the National Park Service – Chickamauga, Kennesaw Mountain and Fort Pulaski – welcomed nearly three million visitors who spent over \$200 million in local gateway regions, supporting more than 2,800 jobs. These figures do not include visitation to state and local battlefield parks such as Allatoona Pass, Fort McAllister, Fort Morris and Pickett's Mill, among others.

A small annual investment of \$1 million via the Vince Dooley Battlefield Trust Fund will bolster historic preservation efforts throughout Georgia, ensuring these special places remain. As Georgia prepares for our nation's 250th birthday celebration, there has never been a better time to invest in its historic preservation and complete the work begun in the Georgia House last year, when it passed Resolution 1435 recommending creation of the Vince Dooley Battlefield Trust Fund.

We urge you to establish the Vince Dooley Battlefield Trust Fund so the hallowed places where Georgians once fought and fell are not lost for future generations. We stand ready to assist you in this very worthwhile endeavor. Thank you for your consideration.
