The Visitor Center theater is open - the movie is being shown.


The Mountain Rd. is open to motorized vehicles on weekdays only (excluding major holidays)

John Ward Creek Crossing Closed to Horseback Riders

Kennesaw, GA – Effective immediately, the John Ward Creek crossing just south of the Illinois Monument is closed to horseback riders until further notice. This closure stems from a safety concern due to hazardous conditions relating to an unstable streambed. The closure affects the creek crossing between Milepost 3.5 and Milepost 4 of the Kolb's Farm East Trail.

Superintendent Patrick Gamman states, "We are concerned for the safety of all park users. Crossing John Ward Creek at this section of the trail poses a risk that we want to alert our horse community to, as it could potentially cause harm to both horse and rider. We will be working as quickly as possible to mitigate this problem."

Stilesboro Road Closures - Beginning May 6, 2025

Kennesaw Mountain NBP, Cobb County DOT, and Cobb County Marietta Water Authority (CCMWA) have been working together regarding a large upcoming project regarding Stilesboro Road. Please plan accordingly when coming to the park to volunteer. The park will be providing additional information through the various media outlets; however, if you have any questions, please feel free to contact the park. If any changes to the schedule takes place, you will be notified.

Below is the information provided by the project manager:

Beginning on Tuesday, May 6, the Cobb County Department of Transportation, and Cobb County Marietta Water Authority (CCMWA) contractors will be closing Stilesboro Road to replace and upgrade an underground water piping system that runs underneath the centerline of the road. This closure will occur in three phases and will also tie into the pre-construction work affiliated with the proposed new roundabouts on Old 41 Highway.

- Phase 1 of this closure of Stilesboro Road will span from Gilbert Road to Old Mountain Road. This closure will begin on Tuesday, May 6.
- Phase 2 of this road closure will span from Old Mountain Road to NPS Visitor Center Drive and work is expected to begin early August.
- Phase 3 of this road closure will span from Old 41 Highway to NPS Visitor Center Drive and work is expected to begin late September.


There will be multiple detours to utilize while traveling during this necessary closure. Please reference the approved detour map.

It's Hot Out There! Don't Become a Victim of Heat-related Illnesses.

The first half of the year is already complete; however, we have truly just begun summer. In typical Atlanta fashion, the city has once again proved its nickname of Hotlanta. With the heat index already reaching into the high 90s and even into the 100s, it is important to be aware of yourself as you enjoy the summer and while volunteering at Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park.

Heat-related illnesses include heat stroke, heat exhaustion, rhabdomyolysis, heat syncope, heat cramps, and heat rash. Anyone is susceptible to experiencing heat-related illnesses, especially if they are exposed to extreme heat or work in hot environments. Heat stroke is the most serious of the illnesses. It occurs when the body can no longer control its temperature. When heat stroke occurs, the internal body temperature can reach 106 degrees or higher within 10-15 minutes. It can lead to permanent disability or even death if emergency treatment is not received.

Symptoms

- Confusion altered mental status, slurred speech.
- Loss of consciousness (coma)
- Hot, dry skin or profuse sweating
- Seizures
- Very high body temperature
- Fatal if treatment is delayed.

Heat Exhaustion is the body's response to an excessive loss of water and salt, usually through excessive sweating.

<u>Symptoms</u>

- Headache
- Nausea
- Dizziness
- Weakness
- Irritability
- Thirst
- Heavy sweating
- Elevated body temperature
- Decreased urine output.

It is always best to be aware of ourselves and the environment that one is volunteering or enjoying outdoor summer activities. With these risks in mind, please take some steps to help protect yourself when temperature is extremely high.

- Stay in an air-conditioned indoor location as much as you can.
- Drink plenty of fluids even if you don't feel thirsty.
- Schedule outdoor activities carefully.
 - Wear loose, lightweight, light-colored clothing and sunscreen.
 - Pace yourself and take breaks.
- Take cool showers or baths to cool down.
- Check on a friend or neighbor and have someone do the same for you.
- Never leave children or pets in cars.
- Check the local news for health and safety updates.

Remember: If you think you or someone with you may be experiencing a heat-related illness, CALL 911 to provide immediate medial assistance. Kennesaw Mountain NBP greatly appreciates all the hard work that volunteers do for the park and the staff wants to ensure that you have a safe time as you enjoy giving back, even during the hot summers of the south.

Trust for Public Land Closes on Kennesaw Mountain Acquisition *Project Will Add More Than 21 Acres to Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield*

ATLANTA (June 24, 2025) – Trust for Public Land has closed on the acquisition of 21.467 acres of land at Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park, one of the most historically significant and visited Civil War sites in the Southeast. This critical addition ensures the land—previously at risk of residential development—will instead be permanently protected for public recreation, historical education and conservation.

Trust for Public Land's long-standing goal at Kennesaw Mountain is to preserve this nationally significant battlefield by linking key parcels of land to create a cohesive park that supports public exploration and learning. The newly acquired property, now under National Park Service ownership, safeguards not only the rural, open character of the area but also any Civil War-related archaeological resources that may lie beneath its surface. As an added benefit, the site includes a small pond now designated as a critical water source for forest fire protection. During a forest fire in March 2025, helicopters used the pond to fill firefighting buckets with water for fire suppression.

"In partnership with the National Park Service, we're proud to protect this historic land for future generations," said George Dusenbury, Georgia State Director for Trust for Public Land. "This acquisition isn't just about adding acreage—it's about preventing the fragmentation of this irreplaceable landscape and keeping it from being lost to suburban development. Thanks to the support of the Land and Water Conservation Fund and the National Park Foundation, we've ensured this land remains part of the story of our shared history."

This acquisition builds on decades of effort by Trust for Public Land to expand and protect the park. In 2008, the organization worked closely with the Hensley family, long-time area residents, to acquire approximately 34 acres of their land, bringing critical forest and field areas into the park. When the family recently decided to sell an additional 21 acres, Trust for Public Land stepped in to secure the site and finalize the transfer to public ownership.

Today, Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield spans 2,923 acres, including three battlefield areas and 11 miles of preserved Civil War earthworks. The park is a major recreational asset for Cobb County, offering more than 18 miles of interpretive trails, designated picnic areas and access to the only National Park Service property commemorating the Atlanta Campaign of 1864.

Previous park additions by Trust for Public Land include:

- Early 2000s: Approximately 50 acres added to expand park access and continuity.
- **2008:** Acquisition of 34 acres from the Hensley family, featuring forests, fields and a lake.
- **2013:** Addition of the 42-acre Hays Farm, home to Nodine's Hill with remnant Union entrenchments, rifle pits and cannon placements.

Trust for Public Land remains committed to protecting the historic and natural integrity of Kennesaw Mountain—ensuring that its stories can be told, its trails can be walked and its landscapes can be preserved for generations to come.



Museum Tours every Monday, Wednesday, and Friday @ 2:00 pm!



July 5, @11 am – Cheatham Hill Battlefield Tour

The Federal charge at the Dead Angle would be remembered as the deadliest point of fighting during the Battle of Kennesaw Mountain. This program takes you along the battle lines, where you will hear from primary sources describing the frenzied and desperate fight, and learn about the origins of the park. *Parking is at the end of Cheatham Hill Drive (tour stop 3 on brochure).

July 6, @ 11 am – Pigeon Hill Battlefield Tour

On June 27th, 1864, Federal forces advanced against the Confederate trenches north of Burnt Hickory Road. Experience the fight for Kennesaw Mountain as it happened and hear accounts from the soldiers who fought there. There will be some hiking involved up the hill so make sure to have good footwear and plenty of water.

*Parking is at the Burnt Hickory Parking Lot (tour stop 4 on brochure).

<u>July 12 @11 am – The Fighting McCooks</u>

On June 27, 1864, Colonel Daniel McCook, Jr. led the Federal assault up Cheatham Hill, where he was mortally wounded. This brave man was not the only McCook to fight for the Federal army. This 30-minute program will introduce the 'Fighting McCooks', the story of 3 Ohio brothers and their 15 sons who joined the Federal forces and fought throughout the Civil War.

*Parking is at the end of Cheatham Hill Drive (tour stop 5 on brochure).

July 13 @ 11 am, 12 pm, 2 pm and 3 pm – Henry Rifle Program

The American Civil War has become known for its rapid advancement in weapons technology. At the foot of Big Kennesaw Mountain, elements of the 66th Illinois charged the Confederate works with a weapon that would revolutionize warfare: the Henry Repeater. The programs at the above- listed times include firing demonstrations of this weapon.

July 19 @11 am, 12 pm, 2 pm and 3 pm – Infantry Demonstrations

The Civil War was the first modern war in history, fought using tactics and techniques still relevant to the battlefield today. Come out and experience our living historians as they encamp and offer rifle firing demonstrations at the above-listed times.

July 20, @11 am, 12 pm, 2 pm and 3 pm – Artillery Demonstrations

Artillery was a vital component to the operations of both armies during the Atlanta Campaign and played a key role in several engagements during the Battle of Kennesaw Mountain. Our living historians will hold camp and shoot the cannon at the above- listed times.

July 26, @11 am- Animals of Kennesaw Mountain

As the largest continuous green space outside of metro- Atlanta, Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park is home to many kinds of animals. In this program fit for all ages, learn about the birds and beasts you may encounter while out on our 22 miles of trails.

*Program will be at the pavilion behind the Visitor Center.

July 27, @ 2 pm - Museum Tour

The story of the Battle of Kennesaw Mountain is told in this hour-long indoor program, using the artifacts in our park museum as a medium. Along with the park film, this program is designed as a great primer to get you ready to explore the battlefield.

*All outdoor programs are weather- dependent.



Workdays 06-07-25 and 06-14-25

The workplan for Saturday June 7th involved the REI Corporate Workday and the cyclic maintenance of the 24 Gun Trail.

We had 9 crew leaders for the workday. The Crew Leaders were Curt, Donald, Eric, Geoff, Kirsten, Rich, Robert, Tom, and me. We had 1 Trail Ambassador, Barb. She did registration and the Crew Leaders directed parking. Geoff monitored the parking lot and both the Trail Club and REI tents. We had 6 volunteers, 4 from the website and 2 REI employees.

I welcomed the volunteers, introduced Patrick, reviewed the workplan, and conducted the safety briefing. We split into two groups.

Team 1, led by Rich with Robert and Curt assisting, and included 3 of the volunteers. They started on the workplan at the trail head on Gilbert Road, debermed and reset the fencing by bridge 5, and debermed to cannon 4. From there they went to the section of the workplan where they filled a standing water area with rocks. After they finished this they
