John Ward Creek Crossing Closed to Horseback Riders

Kennesaw, GA – Effective immediately, the John Ward Creek crossing just south of the Illinois Monument is closed to horseback riders until further notice. This closure stems from a safety concern due to hazardous conditions relating to an unstable streambed. The closure affects the creek crossing between Milepost 3.5 and Milepost 4 of the Kolb's Farm East Trail.

Superintendent Patrick Gamman states, "We are concerned for the safety of all park users. Crossing John Ward Creek at this section of the trail poses a risk that we want to alert our horse community to, as it could potentially cause harm to both horse and rider. We will be working as quickly as possible to mitigate this problem."

Stilesboro Road Closures - Beginning May 6, 2025

Kennesaw Mountain NBP, Cobb County DOT, and Cobb County Marietta Water Authority (CCMWA) have been working together regarding a large upcoming project regarding Stilesboro Road. Please plan accordingly when coming to the park to volunteer. The park will be providing additional information through the various media outlets; however, if you have any questions, please feel free to contact the park. If any changes to the schedule takes place, you will be notified.

Below is the information provided by the project manager:

Beginning on Tuesday, May 6, the Cobb County Department of Transportation, and Cobb County Marietta Water Authority (CCMWA) contractors will be closing Stilesboro Road to replace and upgrade an underground water piping system that runs underneath the centerline of the road. This closure will occur in three phases and will also tie into the pre-construction work affiliated with the proposed new roundabouts on Old 41 Highway.

- Phase 1 of this closure of Stilesboro Road will span from Gilbert Road to Old Mountain Road. This closure will begin on Tuesday, May 6.
- Phase 2 of this road closure will span from Old Mountain Road to NPS Visitor Center Drive and work is expected to begin early August.
- Phase 3 of this road closure will span from Old 41 Highway to NPS Visitor Center Drive and work is expected to begin late September.


There will be multiple detours to utilize while traveling during this necessary closure. Please reference the approved detour map.

Thank You for Your Dedication during 161st Battle Anniversary

Hello Everyone,

It is hard to believe that the 161st Battle Anniversary was two weeks ago. Although we did not have as many volunteers and cannons as in previous years, the two-days were packet full of quality programs and friendly crowds. Over the course of the two-day event, Kennesaw Mountain NBP staff and volunteers offered 56 programs to the visiting public. Programs included artillery and infantry demonstrations, guided hikes and history walks, shuttle bus talks, and children's games and activities. Based on staff calculations, the anniversary reached nearly 1600 visitors.

With such a large event, the staff was unable to provide programs alone. It is due to the devotion and support of over 75 volunteers that the park was able to offer such an event. The artillery demonstrations were provided by volunteer artillery crews from Kennesaw Mountain NBP and Stephens Light Artillery. Infantry programs were provided by the 125th Ohio Regiment Inc., the 9th Kentucky, and KEMO Infantry with signal flag programs by the Sons of Union Veterans Civil War. Cheatham Hill Living History Walks were provided by the Co. A, 21st Ohio Volunteer and Brad Shumpert.

In addition, the Children's Art Program was provided by Taylor Hegler, Suzy Roche, and Andrew Miller and other volunteers (I apologize that I do not know the instructor's name) with Megan Barnes, Kate Burton, Karen Petrella, Dave Dubelle, and Barb Orsolits managing the children's tent. This is the second successful year for the Children's Art program. The young artists' works are currently on display in the Education Center until July 14, 2025. Lindsey Barnes once again kept everyone hydrated with his water patrol and the PSAR volunteers provided safety information to the public.

With so many people being part of the event, the Friends of Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park kept everyone fed by providing the funding for the lunches. With our own Ray Hamel and Kyle Carlson manning the grill. Of course, we are always grateful for the event preparation by Maintenance staff and keeping the event safe by our Law Enforcement Rangers Even though only a few volunteer names have been listed, there were so many more that supported hikes, programs, visitor center operations, and food preparation.

It is because of the dedication and support of all volunteers that the park was able to provide such a successful anniversary weekend. There are not enough words to truly express the gratitude of the park staff.



Museum Tours every Monday, Wednesday, and Friday @ 2:00 pm!

August 2, @11 am, 12 pm, 2 pm and 3 pm – Artillery Demonstrations

Artillery was a vital component to the operations of both armies during the Atlanta Campaign and played a key role in several engagements during the Battle of Kennesaw Mountain. Our living historians will hold camp and shoot the cannon at the above- listed times.

August 3, @11am - Life of a Soldier Gear Layout

Life for the infantry soldier (Union or Confederate) was anything but easy. Long marches, bad food, and worse living conditions made it tough going for these young men. Join us as we lay out the gear that made such intense campaigning possible. You will see period-correct uniforms, weaponry and even get up close and personal with artifacts from the Battle of Kennesaw Mountain!

August 9, @ 11 am - Red-Tailed Hawks of Kennesaw Mountain

As the largest continuous green space outside of metro- Atlanta, Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park is home to many kinds of animals. In this program fit for all ages, learn about the one of the most common birds of prey you may encounter while out on our 22 miles of trails.

August 10 @11 am - Cheatham Hill Battlefield Tour

Take a walk around the Confederate defenses of the Dead Angle and learn about the site of the heaviest fighting during the Battle of Kennesaw Mountain.

August 16 and 17th @ 11 am, 12 pm, 2 pm and 3 pm – 31st Alabama Infantry Demonstrations

The Civil War was the first modern war in history, fought using tactics and techniques still relevant to the battlefield today. Come out and experience our living historians as they encamp and offer rifle firing demonstrations at the above-listed times.

August 23 @11 am - Pigeon Hill Battlefield Tour

On June 27th, 1864, Federal forces advanced against the Confederate trenches north of Burnt Hickory Road. Experience the fight for Kennesaw Mountain as it happened and hear accounts from the soldiers who fought there. There will be some hiking involved up the hill so make sure to have good footwear and plenty of water.

*Parking is at the Burnt Hickory Parking Lot (tour stop 4 on brochure).

August 24, @11 am, 12 pm, 2 pm and 3 pm – Henry Rifle Demonstrations

The American Civil War has become known for its rapid advancement in weapons technology. At the foot of Big Kennesaw Mountain, elements of the 66th Illinois charged the Confederate works with a weapon that would revolutionize warfare: the Henry Repeater. The programs at the above-listed times include firing demonstrations of this weapon.

August 30, @11 am- Assault Trail Battlefield Hike

On June 27, 1864, Colonel Daniel McCook, Jr. led the Federal assault up Cheatham Hill, where he was mortally wounded. Walk in the footsteps of these Union soldiers as we charge up Cheatham Hill, listening to accounts written by veterans of the fight along the way.

*Parking is at Activity Area 3 off Cheatham Hill Rd (Tour Stop 6 on brochure)

August 31- September 1, @ 11 am, 12 pm, 2 pm and 3 pm – Artillery Demonstrations






