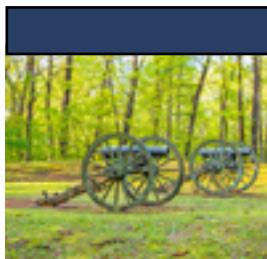

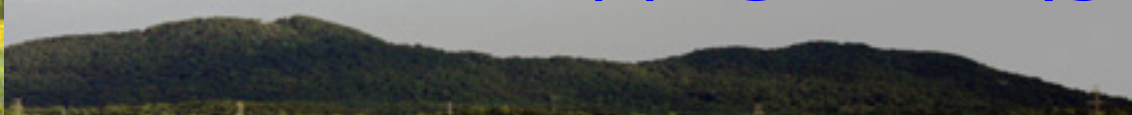

All NPS outdoor events at Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park may be suspended.

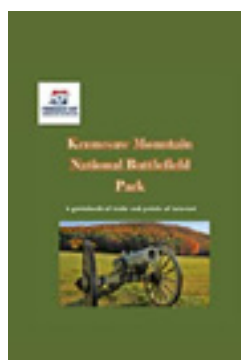
All trails are open, except as noted, below. All parking lots are open. The Mountain Rd. is closed for personal vehicles on weekends and Holidays. ***The Mountain Road parking lot is open when the Mountain Road is open until 12/31/25. After this date the Mountain Road will no longer be open for personal vehicles.***

The shuttle bus is now transporting visitor to/from the Visitor Center/Kennesaw Mountain Top Parking Lot on weekends & Holidays; beginning January 1, 2026, the shuttle will run daily.

John Ward Creek Crossing Closed to Horseback Riders

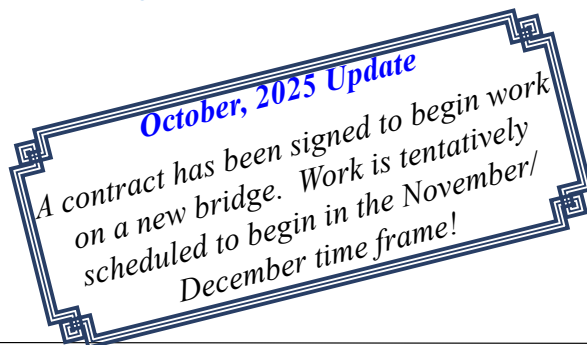
Kennesaw, GA – Effective immediately, the John Ward Creek crossing just south of the Illinois Monument is closed to horseback riders until further notice. This closure stems from a safety concern due to hazardous conditions relating to an unstable streambed. The closure affects the creek crossing between Milepost 3.5 and Milepost 4 of the Kolb's Farm East Trail.

Superintendent Patrick Gamman states, "We are concerned for the safety of all park users. Crossing John Ward Creek at this section of the trail poses a risk that we want to alert our horse community to, as it could potentially cause harm to both horse and rider. We will be working as quickly as possible to mitigate this problem."

Stilesboro Road Closures - Update September, 2, 2025

Kennesaw Mountain NBP, Cobb County DOT, and Cobb County Marietta Water Authority (CCMWA) have been working together regarding a large upcoming project regarding Stilesboro Road. Please plan accordingly when coming to the park to volunteer. The park will be providing additional information through the various media outlets; however, if you have any questions, please feel free to contact the park. If any changes to the schedule takes place, you will be notified.

Below is the information provided by the project manager:

Please be advised that beginning Tuesday, September 2, 2025, the Cobb County Department of Transportation (Cobb County DOT) and the Cobb County Marietta Water Authority (CCMWA) will be closing Stilesboro Road, from Gilbert Road to the Visitor Center's Entrance, to replace and upgrade an underground water main. See the link below for anticipated road closure dates. Access to the visitor center lot will remain open during all phases of construction.

This closure will affect travel routes to the park's Visitor Center. The entrance to the Visitor Center parking lot will only be accessible via Old Highway 41.

Officials from Cobb County DOT have assured that there will be multiple detours around the road closure. This closure is scheduled to occur in three phases and will also tie into the pre-construction work affiliated with the proposed new roundabouts on Old Highway 41.

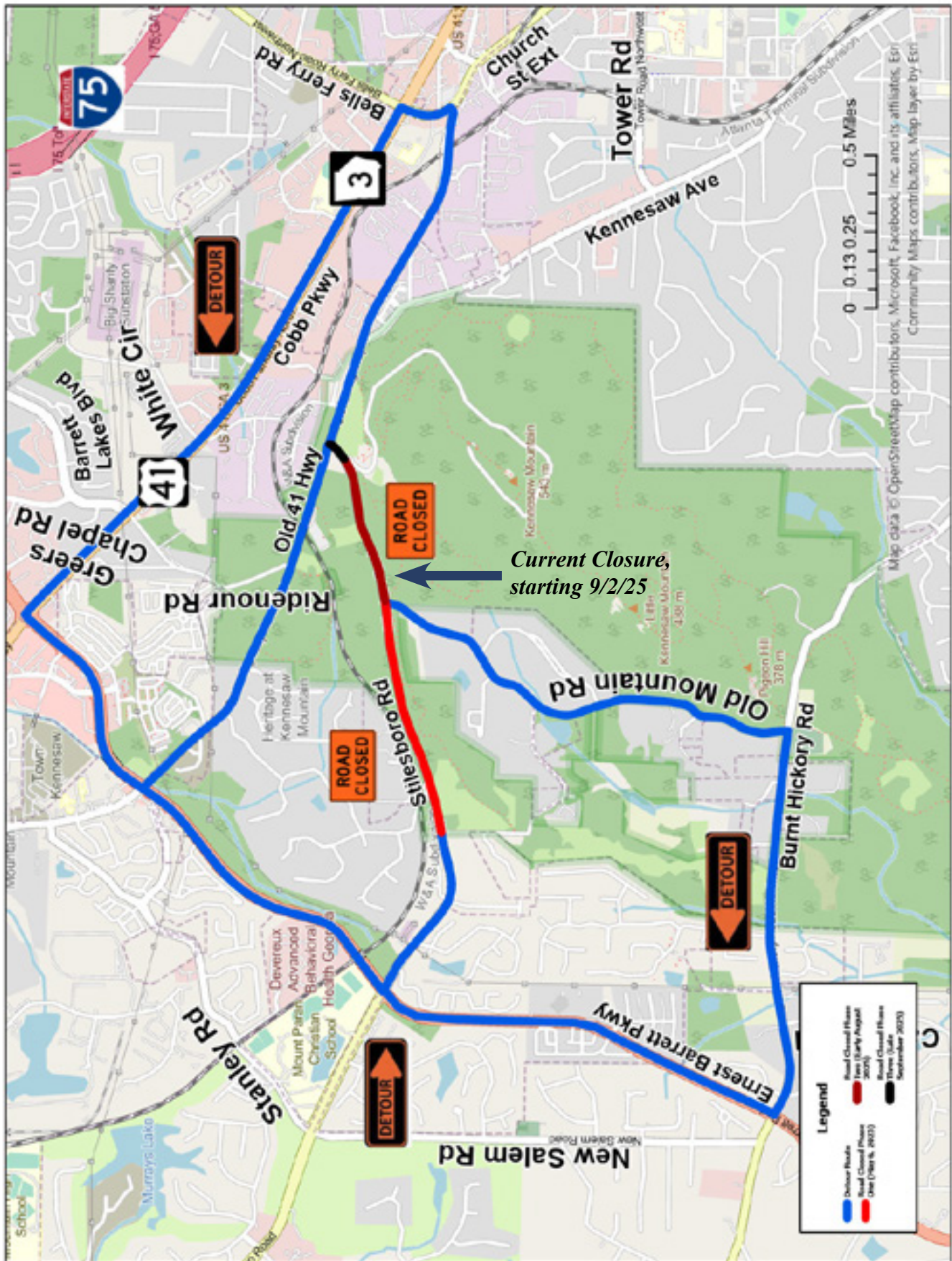

This ranger-led hike will take you roughly 1 mile up to the peak of Big Kennesaw Mountain. Along the way, you'll learn about the flora and fauna of the area and the history that shapes us from pre-history, through Civil War and on to today.

The hike is semi-strenuous so bring water and good shoes!

This plan covers the highly eroded hill on Hardage Mill Trail north of Nose Creek Bridge. We were to build 12 horse steps if we have time and enough volunteers.

With the help of Michael Christman, we cut the 2"x6"s to length, the rebar to length, drilled holes for the rebar in the 2"x6"x6's. We took the material to the worksite and placed the first two steps in position.

On Saturday, Mike welcomed the volunteers, mentioned the October workday and Crew Leader Training, reviewed the day's workplan, Fred took pictures and Geoff watched the parking lot after the ambassadors left.

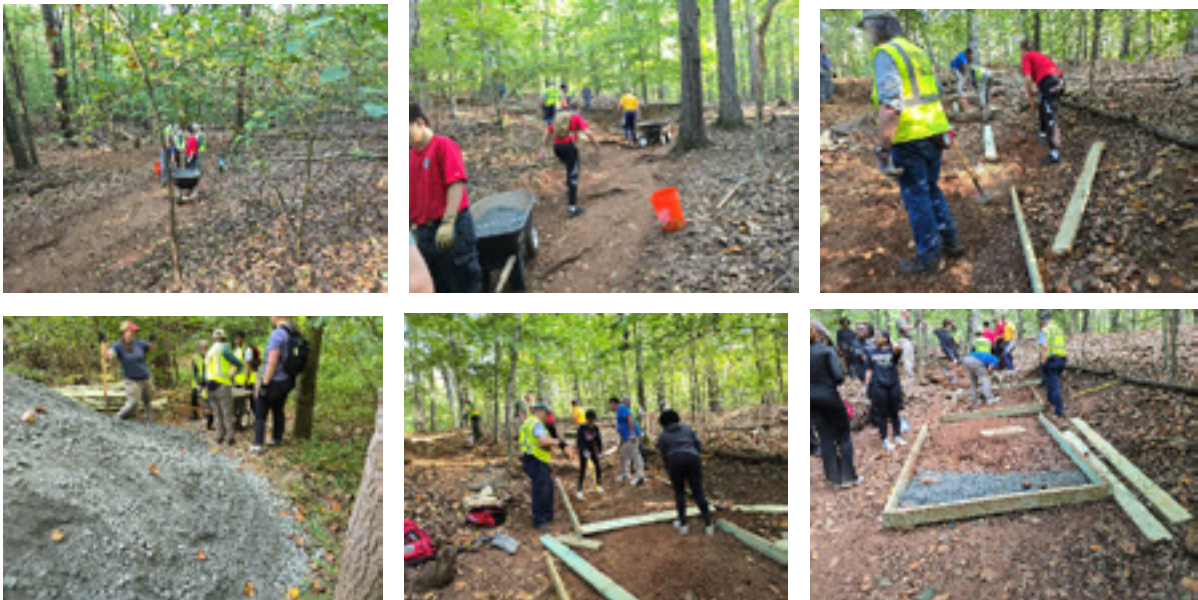

The Trail Club will provide supervision and tools. Volunteers should wear work clothes (**long pants are required**) and closed toed shoes. Participants are encouraged to bring their own water, work gloves and masks. The NPS Volunteer Service Agreement and COVID forms are required, signed by a parent or guardian, if the student is under 18 years old. 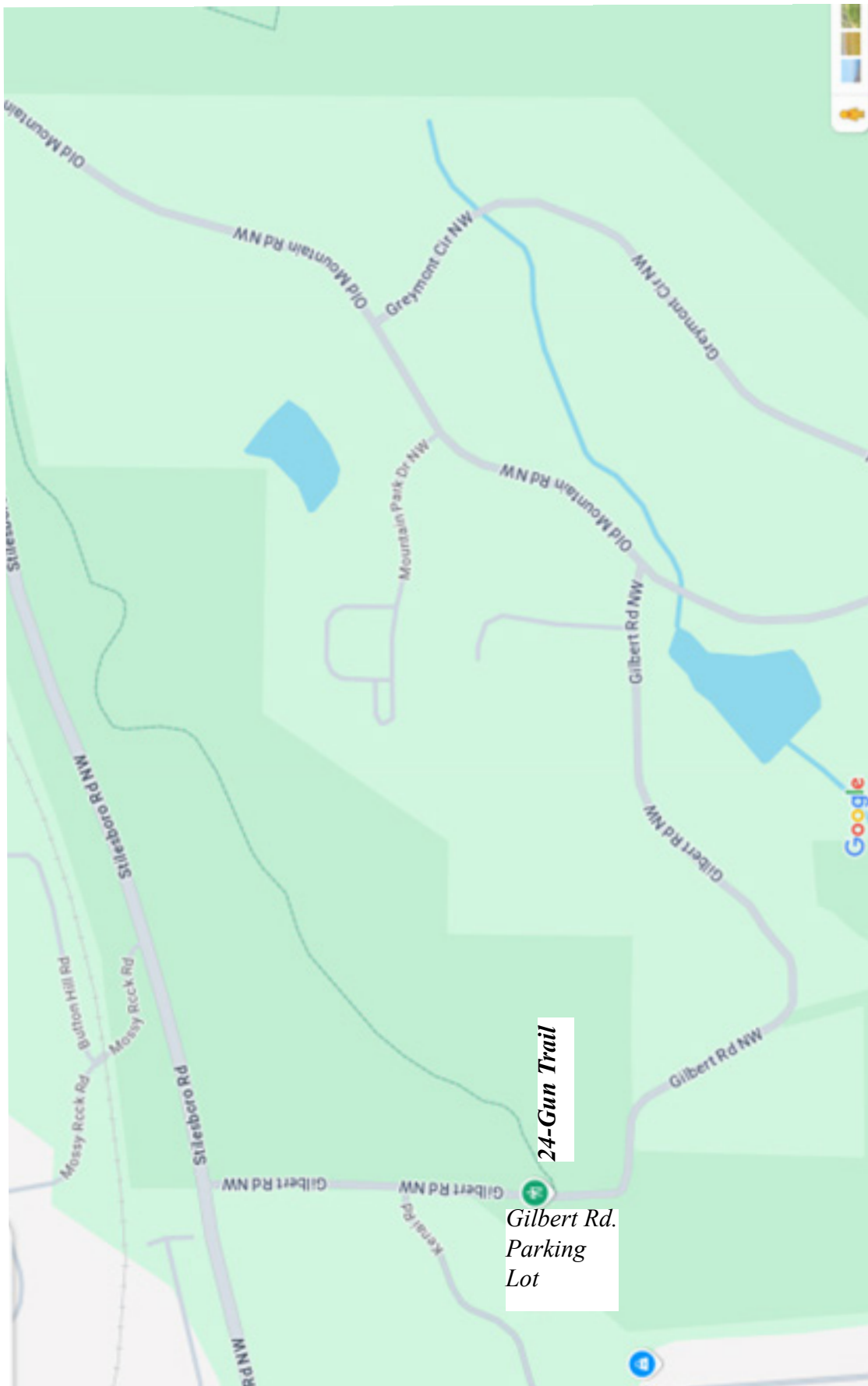

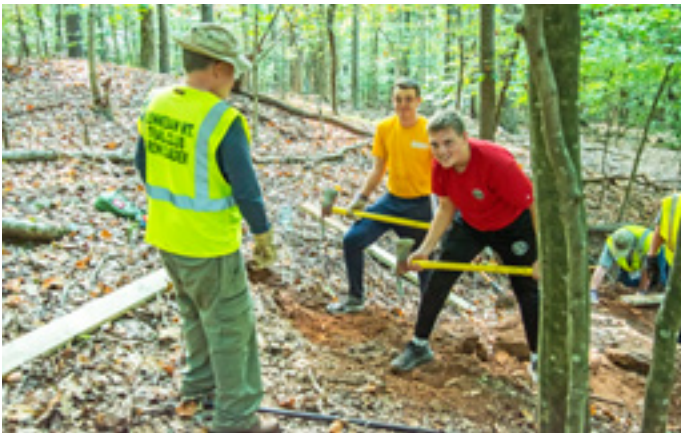
