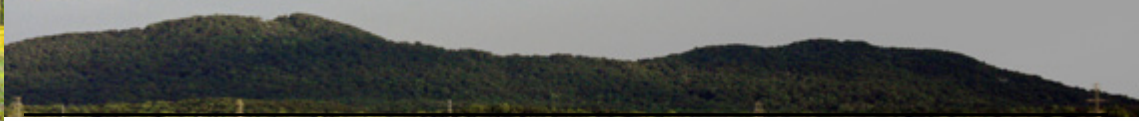

6/13/26 Work Day - Finishing Touches on New Bridge

The new bridge has been completed on Kolb's Farm East Trail. Before the ribbon cutting ceremony in late June several things need to be completed. The three things that need done are:

1. First, the road / trail needs repaired with GAB, the stuff we used on the horse steps.
2. Second, the large bridge was removed by the contractor. We need to remove the small bridge.
3. And third, we need to reinforce the banks on both sides of the bridge with riprap to prevent erosion around the foundation of the bridge. Riprap is the large irregular stones you see around some bridges.

These are scheduled for the June workday on the 13th.

We will meet at the parking lot at the end of Cheatham Hill Drive near the Illinois Monument, and park in the field next to the parking lot.

All trails are open, except as noted, below. All parking lots are open. The Mountain Road parking lot is open only to pedestrian traffic and bicycles at designated times when the Mountain Road is open.

The Visitor Center theater is open - the movie is being shown.

The Mountain Rd. is no longer open to motorized vehicles.

The shuttle bus is now transporting visitor to/from the Visitor Center/Kennesaw Mountain Top Parking Lot.

Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park to Close Mountain Road to Private Vehicles Beginning January 2026

Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park to Close Mountain Road to Private Vehicles Beginning January 2026 as Part of Safety Improvement Project

KENNESAW, Ga. – On Jan. 6, Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park will begin a safety improvement project on Mountain Road to reduce traffic congestion, improve visitor safety, and protect the historic and natural resources of the park. The resulting project will close the road to private motorized vehicles and enable better mixed-use of the road for shuttle service, bicycles and pedestrians. Work includes striping the road and improvements to the summit and shuttle plaza.

“This change in use addresses growing safety concerns on a narrow, heavily used road,” said Acting Superintendent Beth Wheeler. “We understand this change may impact how some visitors experience the park, and we are committed to prioritizing a safe and accessible experience for all visitors while also preserving the natural and historical integrity of the park.”

The 1.5-mile road to the summit will be accessible via daily shuttle service, bicycle, or foot, with a newly striped pedestrian lane open to walkers and hikers. Use of the unpaved one-mile mountain hiking trail will not be affected by the changes to the paved Mountain Road.

Pavement striping is scheduled to begin on or after Jan. 6 and will require intermittent road closures through the end of March and possibly into spring. During this time, visitor access to the summit may be limited.

Cyclist access will be permitted daily from 7:30 a.m. to 10:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. (or 6:30 p.m. during winter hours) outside of shuttle operating times.

Mountain Road, which ascends to the summit of Kennesaw Mountain, is steep, narrow and winding with a 12% grade and several blind curves. As the road is heavily used by a mix of

pedestrians, cyclists and vehicles, the park has seen increasingly frequent traffic incidents, visitor conflicts and medical emergencies. The park conducted public outreach and open house meetings in 2024 to gather feedback and inform the final plan.

Updates will be shared via the park's website, social media and on-site signage.

School Field Trip Program Continues to Grow at Kennesaw Mountain



School field trips to Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park (KEMO) are special learning experience for many school students, and the program at Kennesaw Mountain continues to grow. *“Last year more than 2,500 students participated in guided programs at the park, and this year we’re on track to serve even more.”* said Ranger Jake Boling. *“This program has grown extensively in scale and efficiency over the last several years. It is true that field trips have been offered at KEMO for a number of years and have served the community well. Many of us still remember the incredible CCC programs made possible through the previous KMTC. What has changed since then is the formal creation of the Education Division arm of volunteers. As staffing levels have fluctuated over the years, the success of these trips rely more and more on volunteer service. These VIP’s attend semi-annual trainings, assist the rangers with program development, and*

even lead large portions of these trips. Through this service, we have create what I frequently call a well-oiled machine” added Boling.

Field trips can include a film, a ranger program, and a hike on the battlefield.

The park film, *“One Last Mountain”* tells the story of the Atlanta campaign which began in Chattanooga and led to the fall of Atlanta. One of the more common ranger programs is the ‘Life of a Soldier’ program, which is a presentation by either a living historian or a Ranger. The guided hikes are led along the battle lines of 1864, focusing on the fierce combat and earthworks along the base of Big Kennesaw Mountain and the park’s premiere front Memorial Field. Being able to give both Union and Confederate perspectives to this part of the battle is key to giving the students a balanced guided experience.



A number of Trail Club and Visitor Services members assist with the school visits. All volunteers that lead these trips have to complete online courses and special training to insure the students receive accurate details of the battle. *“While KEMO offers a specific set of programs and activities from teachers to choose from, each experience is different and tailored to the group’s needs. There has to be a lot of flexibility that takes into account time constraints, age, curriculum and specific interests,”* noted Boling.

Like our former sailor, Karen Petrella says, ‘Semper Gumby’ (forever flexible).

Feedback has been very positive from the students and teachers. Most schools make this a part of their teaching program by returning yearly. When asked what they learned during their visit, the students are quick to point out things about the battle, the impact on the 1864 presidential election and even how important it is to avoid poison ivy! One school had the students write thank you letters to the Rangers and volunteers.

In the thank you letters, many students referred to what they learned during their visit and thanked the volunteers and rangers for teaching them.

Age groups range from Kindergarten thru 12th grade. Programming for grades K–3 typically focus on environmental education and National Parks, while history is the main event for the older students. Our biggest demographic by far is 4th grade (9 – 10 years old). While many schools are local to Cobb County and the Atlanta area, there have been classes from Indiana, Ohio, and even Illinois.

The parks program continues to grow and is made possible largely through volunteer service. If you are interested in becoming an 'Education Specialist' and helping with these trips in any capacity, reach out to Ranger Jake Boling at Jacob_boling@nps.gov.

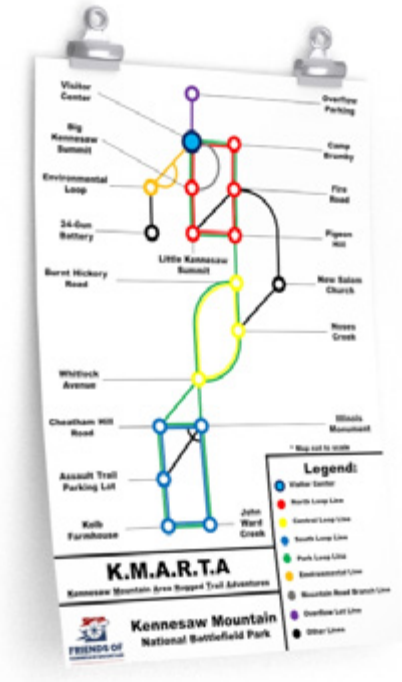

Participants are encouraged to bring their own water, work gloves and masks. The NPS Volunteer Service Agreement and COVID forms are required, signed by a parent or guardian, if the student is under 18 years old.
